Location Now Available for Storm Relief Donations

(ATLANTA) – Companies, organizations and volunteer groups looking to help communities in Georgia impacted by Hurricane Michael can now do so through a donation warehouse. The Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency in partnership with the Federal Emergency Management Agency, has established a multi-county donation warehouse to accept the items storm survivors say they need most.

These items include:

- Paper products, including toilet paper, towels, plates
- Cleaning supplies, like bleach, disinfecting wipes, laundry, sponges, etc.
- Diapers and disposable toddler training pants (all sizes)
- Baby formula
- Baby wipes
- Non-perishable food items, like peanut butter and canned tuna packed in water
- Non-refrigerated flavored drinks, including any type of soda
- Pet food
- Feminine products
- Men, women and children's hygiene items like toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoos
- Charcoal

Terry Haight, disaster response coordinator for the Seventh-day Adventist (SDA) Georgia-Cumberland Conference, is the point of contact for the donation warehouse in Donalsonville, GA. If your organization is interested in donating, please contact Haight first to coordinate supply and drop-off logistics.

The warehouse is open seven days a week from 8 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Donations will be routed from the warehouse to local distributions sites where individuals and families in Miller, Seminole, Early and Decatur counties can pick up the donated goods.

In the meantime, more than 400 FEMA staff are deployed to Georgia, and Disaster Survivor Assistance teams are in the field helping people apply for assistance. FEMA and GEMA/HS are also opening disaster recovery centers where those eligible can apply for individual assistance.
